

What is a Workplace Champion?

A Workplace Champion is a volunteer within a workplace who is trained and supported by MVIP to be the non-judgmental friendly face who work colleagues can approach if they are witnesses, victims or perpetrators of Family Violence and need to find some help.

- There can be more than one Workplace Champion in any one workplace.
- Workplace Champions are trained on how to offer first support and on how to find the right agencies to help the person make contact with.
- They are trained and supported by Deedee, Liz and Vienna from MVIP.

Training & Other Requirements

Workplace Champion volunteers need to complete a module of three training sessions. Modules are being run in May and September each year. If any of the sessions are missed in May they can be caught up in September and vice-versa. Volunteers are required to pass a Police check, provide two forms of ID and sign a model release form for their poster portrait.

Training Sessions

1. Introduction to MVIP and Speaker from "It's Not OK".
2. Learn about the partner Agencies that can help.
3. Learn how to get help for one of your colleagues.

Once the 3 modules have been completed the Workplace Champion will receive their own A3 Poster for their staffroom.
